2014-2015 was a good year for the Shuswap Hospital Foundation and things continue to move forward positively.

Last year's major project was the completion of the CAT scan upgrade, at a cost of \$204,959, which is extremely important to our community. We spent a total of \$295,094 on equipment purchases. We had a very successful fall campaign and an excellent Radiothon and raised over \$240k in these two events. Volunteers are a substantial part of our campaigns and I wish to thank everyone who helped with these events and our organization throughout the year. We also continued our partnership with the Shuswap Hospital Auxiliary through their walk, Footsteps for our Future, as they raise money for women's health and work as a valuable partner in improving health care.

Our fundraising focus this year is a \$112,000 campaign to raise \$74,000 for the renovation of the ICU and \$38,300 for renovations to the chemotherapy unit. This is in addition to \$199,667 in regular

equipment upgrades. We recognize that we will be digging into reserves but these critical improvements to our health care infrastructure are integral to the wellbeing of our community patients. On the fundraising side we completed a new fundraiser in the First Annual Shuswap Hospital Foundation Charity Open. A big thank you to all of our committee and hardworking volunteers that made this a smashing success raising in excess of \$46,000. Thank you as well to our title sponsors for the event, Shuswap Lake Estates Golf & Country Club and Askew's Foods.

None of the work of the Shuswap Hospital Foundation would be possible without our generous donors and sponsors. The giving attitude of the Shuswap never ceases to amaze me. When asked, the community always steps up and exceeds our expectations, digging deep into their pockets throughout the year. On behalf of The Shuswap Hospital Foundation, thank you.

I would also like to thank our hardworking Board members who provide guidance and direction for the Foundation, for their support of the Foundation and myself during my first year as president. We have two retiring Board members this year, Dr. Brian Ayotte and Mr. Jim Kimmerly. Brian is a past president and his knowledge of the medical profession and systems have been a great source of guidance for the Foundation. Jim has served as Secretary of the Foundation for the past number of years and provided great support in the areas of finance, planned giving, and most lately as part of the organizing committee for our golf tournament. 

Renovations to the chemotherapy area will bring a new level of comfort and accessibility to our patients

Shuswap Lake Hospital's intensive care unit (ICU) provides urgent critical care annually to over 1,000 patients. The ICU staff must be able to maneuver efficiently in the area while accessing equipment and supplies in life threatening situations. They must do this while respecting patient privacy, confidentiality, and maintaining a secure facility. Currently ICU accommodates three patients at a time. The centre of the facility is the nursing station which patients, staff and visitors pass through to access washroom facilities as well as entering and exiting the unit.

The chemotherapy unit provides infusion therapy to both inpatients and outpatients. The current

configuration of the unit accommodates three treatment chairs where patients spend from two to six hours each time they receive treatment. The Chemo area currently serves over 800 patient treatments per year and due to lack of space patients often receive their infusion in the waiting area which is situated in the hallway.

The wing of the hospital housing these two units was built in 1962, and was originally regular patient rooms as well as a pediatric unit. Over the years sections have changed purpose and have been renovated to suit, which included changing floor plans. The result is a space that is chopped up space overcrowded and challenging to work

in. The Shuswap Hospital Foundation has agreed to fund the renovation of both areas so that their critical functions can be performed more efficiently and in an environment that is serviceable for both the patients and staff providing care.

In addition to the cosmetic renovations like painting, and upgrading of electrical and lighting, each unit will have many layout and design changes. In ICU one of the most needed changes will be the moving of the washrooms away from the nurses' station. This move and privacy glass installation will improve visibility and workflow while improving the confidentiality of patient information.



Creating better places



The intensive care unit is vital to our hospital. The renovation will provide an efficient way to deliver high-level patient care

There will be a new automatic sliding door with security at the entrance and a separate report desk for medical staff. One of the most important changes will be a new drug preparation area to accommodate secure dispensing units and new Pyxis Supply station will be installed. This station is a secure storage device that provides easy access to supplies in emergency situations. It also documents usage in real time and improves work flow for medical staff.

The chemotherapy unit like ICU will also receive the cosmetic renovations and upgrades. Moving walls and relocation of the nurses' station will create a larger treatment area accommodating the addition of two more treatment chairs bringing the total amount of treatment chairs in the

chemotherapy unit to five. This alone will eliminate the requirement to treat patients in the waiting area ensuring their comfort and privacy. Moving the entrance door and closing off the area south of the waiting area will create a self contained unit.

The renovation has been a long time coming and its completion will enhance patient care in both units while optimizing efficien-

There is one additional area which will get a workover in this renovation. The office space at the Hospitals front entrance will be converted into a 'Sacred Space' where patients and families can spend time. The space will provide a quiet, peaceful, private and serene area for those needing respite.



Shuswap Lake Health Care Auxiliary

Our fundraising efforts over the past several years have enabled the members of the Shuswap Lake Health Care Auxiliary to purchase equipment for our local hospital and care facility. Bastion Place received 20 chairs, 3 tables and a laptop computer in May. We also purchased ten floor hockey jerseys for the residents. The Shuswap Hospital Foundation completed their funding goal to purchase the CT scan upgrade with our donation of \$17,785.34.

A vein finder (pictured at right) was purchased for the lab and a pair of hysteroscopes (pictured at top right) were purchased for the OR. The latter purchase was made possible by funds raised for our annual "Footsteps for our Future" walk on Mother's Day. In September, we awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to a Youth Health Care Volunteer furthering her education in the medical field.

In April, kindergarten students from various schools enjoyed tours of our hospital, led by volunteers. Our members have been busy this year sewing, knitting and crocheting comfort caps for chemo patients. Our mandate is to add to the comfort and welfare of patients and residents in our care facility. A request was made for lap quilts for Level 2 which are being made by our members. We are also providing quilted lap quilts for the chemo department as needed. The knitted, crocheted and sewn items in our gift shop are made by members. We also greet patients and visitors on Level 4 and in the ER.

The entrance windows on Level 4 will once again be painted in December, courtesy of the Auxiliary ladies. We will be adopting a family at Christmas through the Safe House Society.

The fundraising efforts of this hard working, dy-

lows medical staff to regulate cooling and warming as required to reliably stabilize patient temperature.

Angels to the Rescue

In 2013 the Shuswap Hospital Foundation pledged to raise funds to upgrade the CT scanner at Shuswap Lake General Hospital. The upgrade was needed to improve functionality and to extend the life of the scanner. Even though the required funds added to an already impressive funding goal, the board felt the need justified the challenge. Throughout the year we worked to raise the needed funds, and by year end we had raised all but \$17,785.34 of the required funds to cover the CT scanner upgrade.

Pleased with our progress and needing to raise the shortfall, we were thrilled when a group of angels stepped up to cover the balance. Those angels are the Shuswap Lake Health Care Hospital Auxiliary.

Founded in 1911, the Auxiliary members provide key communication services to the public and patients at the front entry and in emergency. They greet and direct the public and day surgery patients on a daily basis. The Auxiliary also works year-long raising money to fund various health care needs in the community. The Shuswap Hospital Foundation is extremely grateful for the selfless dedication of the Auxiliary and its members who volunteer hundreds of hours. Their hugely generous donation of \$17,785.34 to complete the funding of the CT scanner upgrade is only one example of their exceptional commitment to improving the quality of health care in our community.

Community Clinic Health Care

As there are a significant number of patients who receive in-home support on a regular basis, support is available to allow them to remain as independent as possible while living in their own homes. The services provided by the community care team in Salmon Arm assists those patients who need this level of support. The 'Home is Best' mandate is the focus of these provided services and the programs include case management and long term care services, adult day program, palliative care, occupational and physiotherapy services and ambulatory nursing clinic. These services assist in preventing hospitalization and facilitate respite care in providing a significant adult day service.

Home health services can be accessed through direct referral from physicians, hospital or self/family. Referrals can

also be coordinated for those clients who can no longer remain at home and require services at a residential home as well as provide palliative care services for the client and their families.

The recent renovation of the ambulatory nursing clinic was funded by the Shuswap Hospital Foundation. This renovation greatly improved the working space and provided better efficiencies.

The ambulatory nursing clinic is designed for those people who are living at home in the community. Wound care dressings can be changed or other services offered without having to go to the GP office or the hospital.

The philosophy of care is to support independence and health with the goal of maintaining clients in the community setting for as long as possible.









Throughout our lives we are aware of health care in general but we really just take for granted it is there if we need it. As we age, healthcare takes on a broader definition, or we hope it does. It means not only doctors and hospitals and the menagerie that goes with them for when you are sick, but also ongoing help and support for all those issues we don't think about till we need them. We all know that for some the "golden years" can be tarnished with physical limitations, chronic health issues, and for some, loneliness and even abandonment. Quality of life becomes a serious concern.

In the communities serviced by the Shuswap Lake General Hospital it is encouraging to see the various levels of care and alternatives offered. In Salmon Arm we have Bastion Place, Hillside Village, Mount Ida Mews, Piccadilly Care Centre, and Pioneer

Lodge. These homes offer various levels of assistance as well as providing a community for the residents including everything needed for a well-rounded satisfying life. A key element in the senior care is Harmony Haven, an adult day services program and a part of Shuswap Home Health Services. It's a place for our community's seniors and elders who are experiencing challenges in their physical, mental, or social well-being. By participating in these services, caregivers for our seniors receive the respite they need. In Sicamous surrounding the Sicamous Seniors Activity Centre there are three facilities: The Haven, a micro-community offering 1 and 2 bedroom independent living units; and the Lodge and Manor which offer several levels of assisted living. It is gratifying to see that efforts continue to ensure that seniors are provided with a quality of life through all stages of life.



Sicamous Lab

It has been three years since the Foundation made it possible to provide lab services in the Health Unit in Sicamous. Open Thursday mornings, the clinic makes it possible for local residents to have lab samples taken without the sometimes onerous task of making the trip into Salmon Arm. The lab is particularly appreciated by those patients who require weekly or frequent testing.

Also, the Sicamous Medical Clinic continues to offer its usual high caliber of family practice and now is offering additional options. Every 6 weeks the Foot Nurse holds a clinic by appointment offering basic and medical foot care to local residents. Foot care is critically important to diabetic patients, seniors, and anyone with issues such as ingrown toenails. Sicamous Medical Clinic is now also offering the services of a women's nurse by appointment the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. This nurse performs pap tests, breast exams, and other services required by women. Health care options are undergoing changes and it's great to see leading edge practices happening in our community.

Sorrento Nurse Practitioner's Office

The Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre has now been operational for nearly two years, providing primary health care to residents and visitors to Sorrento and area. The Centre is unique in British Columbia, with Nurse Practitioner Judy Deringer operating independently, whereas most NPs are embedded in a Health Authority facility or a physician's practice.

Judy has seen over 1100 people. She is loved by the community. Residents, especially our seniors, love having health care locally so they don't have to travel to Salmon Arm. Judy is fully booked every day.

Everyone has been so supportive. The Shuswap Hospital Foundation was one of the first agencies to assist them by providing the original exam room equipment. It is because of the support and generosity of so many in our communities that they


can boast of the success they have experienced.

Their achievements during the two years include establishing the Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre Society, obtaining CRA charitable status, moving from volunteer receptionists to a qualified Medical Office Assistant, obtaining a physician billing number, receiving operational funding from the Ministry of Health and becoming an established part of the infrastructure of Sorrento. They are currently expanding the facility by developing a third exam room so that we can accommodate another practitioner.

Recognition wall


