The Shuswap Hospital Foundation continues to surpass its annual fundraising goals because of the overwhelming generosity of the residents of the Shuswap. The donations we receive enable us to purchase much needed equipment and to fund upgrades to the hospital that improve the experience of those who use its services. In addition to the \$178,228 that was spent this year on equipment upgrades, we were pleased to be able to provide funding in the amount of \$14,750 to create a Sacred Space within the hospital. The Sacred Space offers a peaceful, calming and culturally inclusive environment that will be welcoming for everyone,

Another addition to the hospital is two new palliative care rooms. Bladder Scanner

A Bladder Scanner provides medical personnel with the ability to view an image of the bladder and measure bladder volume.

Cystoscope

A cystoscope is a thin tube with a camera enabling medical staff to gather accurate information during diagnostic procedures.

Laryngoscope

A flexible, lighted tube that allows for the examination of the interior of the larynx (voice box) helping health care staff with efficient and accurate procedures.





Colonoscope

The colonoscope is used during a common procedure called a colonoscopy which will provide important information to assist physicians in their diagnosis.



Video Processor

The Video Processor provides high definition images and superior functions for advanced endoscopic diagnostics and therapy.

Paving the way to better health care options in our community

The Shuswap Hospital Foundation led a fundraising campaign for the creation of two palliative care/end of life rooms at Shuswap Lake General Hospital. These two rooms, located on Level 2 of the hospital, are fitted with a patient bed, furniture which can be used to accommodate family who are spending time with those patients during their stay, and all equipment needed for palliative care.

The much-needed Palliative Care area has been made possible with the assistance and collaboration of five groups, The Shuswap Hospital Foundation, The Shuswap

North Okanagan Division of Family Practice, The Shuswap Hospice Society, Interior Health and the three Rotary Clubs of Salmon Arm. These five groups have worked together as the Community Palliative Care Committee over the past four years to bring this project to completion and to help provide the best quality of life for patients and their families here in the Shuswap.

The cost of the Palliative Care area project is \$130,000 and the Shuswap Hospital Foundation continues to raise funds in order to meet this goal.

"Services are provided by the community care team in Salmon Arm to those patients who need this level of support. Our Community Clinic is currently visited by 400 patients a month."

Services and programs include case management and long-term care services, an adult day program, palliative care, occupational and phys-

iotherapy services as well as an ambulatory nursing clinic.

The Shuswap Hospital Foundation provided the funding for a much-needed renovation of the ambulatory nursing clinic and this has provided much improved efficiencies as well as more comfortable surroundings for those patients attending the clinic.

The Shuswap Hospital Foundation applied for a grant through the Shuswap Community Foundation to enable the purchase of an automated ankle brachial index machine. This purchase was also made possible by a donation of funds from the Sorrento Lions Club. This machine is now in use at the ambulatory nursing clinic and provides medical staff with accurate measurements quickly and efficiently whilst providing a comfortable environment for the patient.

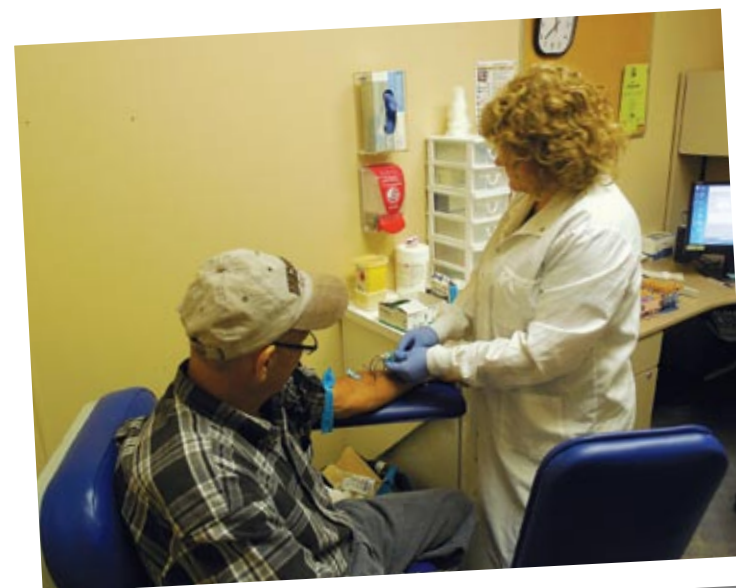
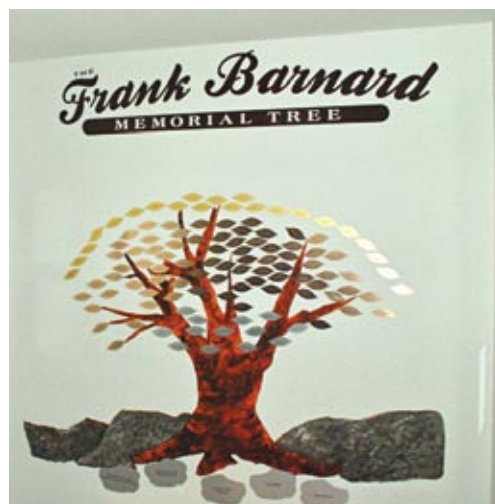

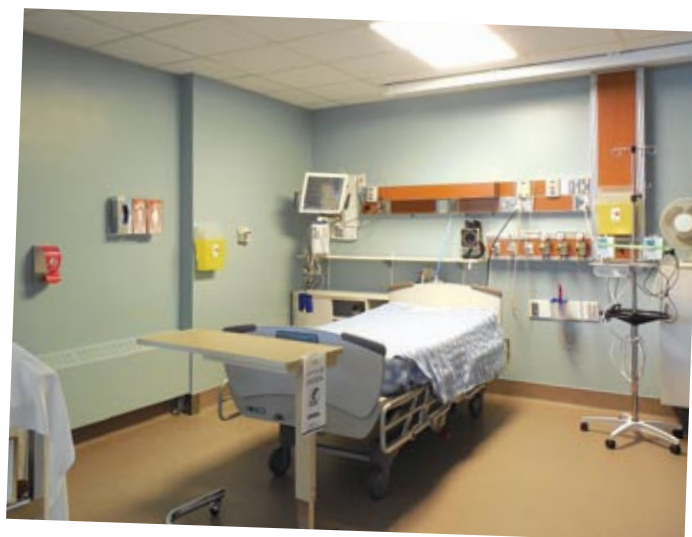
Marilyn Clark, Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre Society, demonstrates the new automatic door.

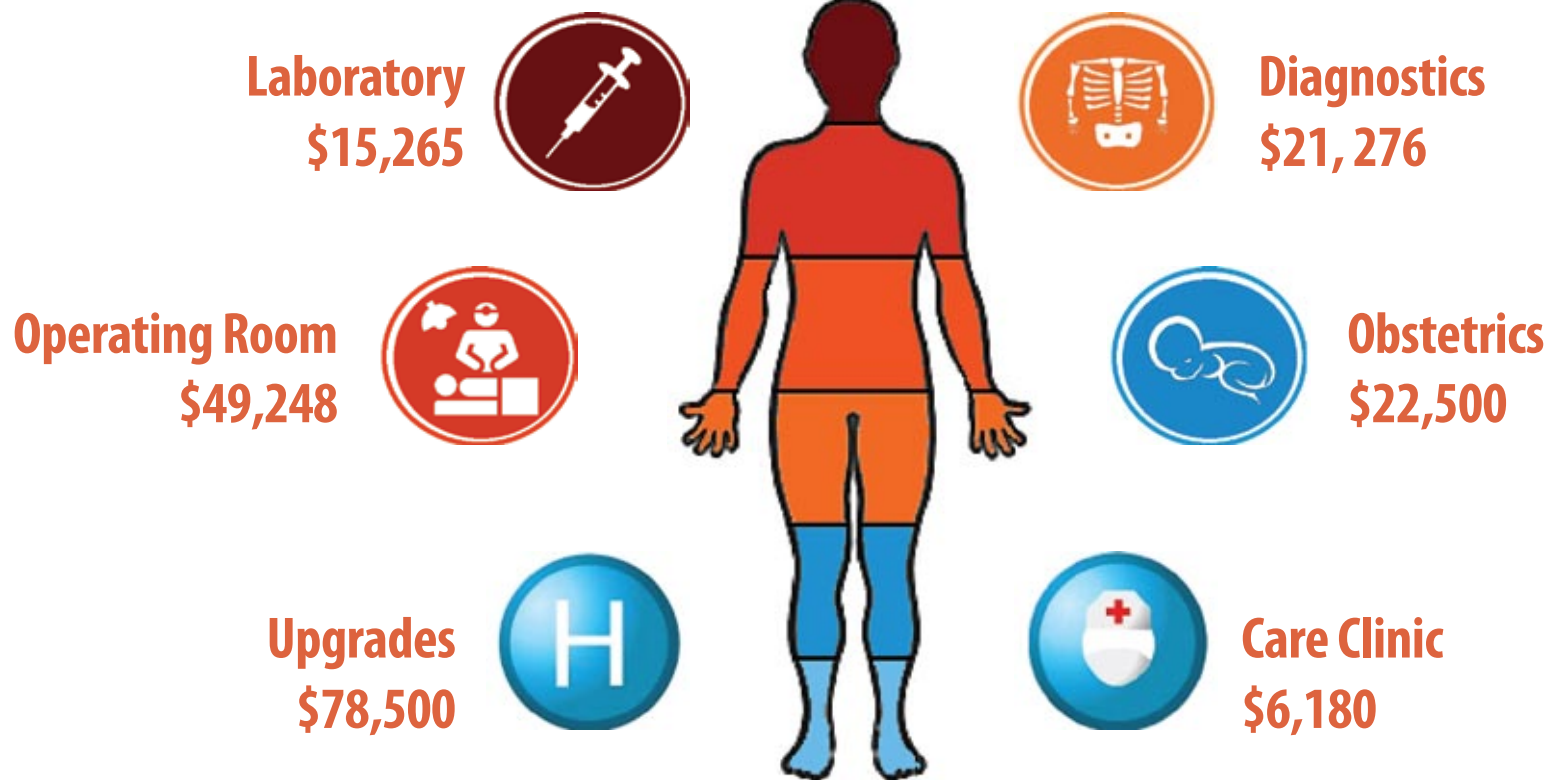


The Sicamous Lab was equipped through the Foundation four years ago and is very much appreciated by those patients requiring weekly or frequent testing.

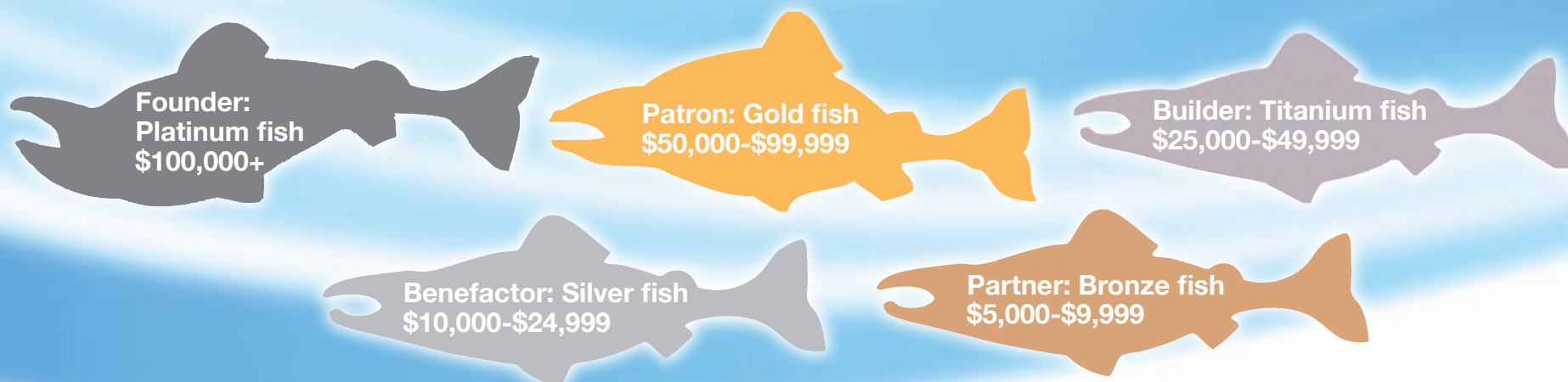
