Official opening of palliative care rooms at Bastion Place

Centenarian Clara Johnson assisted by Town Crier Pat Allwood officially opens the Foundations Distinguished Donor Recognition Wall located by the waiting room of the new Emergency Dept. Over 3,000 donors, businesses, charities and community groups helped raise over 3 million dollars for priority equipment needs.

The Shuswap Lake General Hospital Endowment Foundation Society was formed and registered as a charitable society in June 1986. With the express purpose to support and improve services and care for patients at the Shuswap Lake General Hospital.

In 1987-88 a major fundraising campaign was organized to help equip the new 100 bed Bastion Place. Chairman of the Society was Ralph Owens, with support of co-campaign chairs Dick Smith and Peter Kilby. Over \$300,000 was raised to provide furnishings including special electric beds; a new innovation at that time. A major contributor was the SALMAR Theatre Association who provided funding for a bus.

In 1991 the Foundation co-operated on a regional basis to provide the first CT scanner at Vernon Jubilee Hospital, The project had a \$350,000 target, our share \$48,766.85 was reached within a year.

In 1991 the Foundation undertook to provide a palliative care room at the hospital.

In 1996 three health care societies of the Shuswap were amalgamated. This brought together the Shuswap Lake General Hospital Society, The Pioneer Lodge Society and the Home support Services Society. With this amalgamation the Foundation name was changed to the Shuswap Lake Health Care Foundation

Society with a mandate to support the Shuswap Lake General Hospital, Pioneer Lodge & Bastion Place. Amalgamation broadened its objectives to address the diverse needs; Projects included establishing a secure garden at Pioneer Lodge, Hospital equipment upgrades and renovations for a new home support facility.

By 2001 the Foundation accepted the challenge to support furnishing 3 rooms for palliative care; with a linked family room and a patio, the rooms are established at Bastion Place.

In 2006 the Foundation was given its greatest challenge; to support hospital expansion equipment needs for the new emergency and diagnostic imaging departments, including a CT scanner. This included capital equipment needs in the Pharmacy, Laboratory, and trauma rooms. The Foundations volunteer board of Directors recognized the need to broaden the fundraising and administrative capabilities to effectively accomplish the multi-million dollar commitment. This included a name change to the Shuswap Hospital Foundation to more readily identify with the expanding role; this included adding a computerized donor record keeping and tax receipting system. With the addition of a website and on-line donor support program we were able to provide a more efficient communication system with all donors.

After the last few years of major fundraising for items including the CT scanner and equipment for the expanded Emergency and Diagnostic Imaging Departments, the Foundation can now focus on some of the other urgent needs for the hospital and other health care services.

We are so pleased to see the acquisition of a bus for use by Bastion Place and Harmony Haven clients. The community has again been so very generous. A Trauma X-ray machine will be installed this fall which will bring the long awaited third x-ray machine into service. Newborns will also benefit with the addition of the portable incubator.

Priority equipment needs continue to present themselves. The Foundation with the continued generosity of the community will be supporting additional equipment valued at over \$400,000 in the next several months. This equipment will be available to improve services in the operating rooms, the laboratory, Emergency, Bastion Place and Harmony Haven by way of the current Silver Jubilee Campaign.

It is a pleasure to work with the Board, staff and volunteers who create the environment to fulfill the many challenges we achieve each year. We have been fortunate to have had the wisdom of dedicated volunteer board members, some from the inception of the organization.

The committees structure of the board and the succession planning, along with the policies and procedures of the foundation all help to serve us well.

We offer our thanks as we work to a common cause of making our community a better and healthier place...

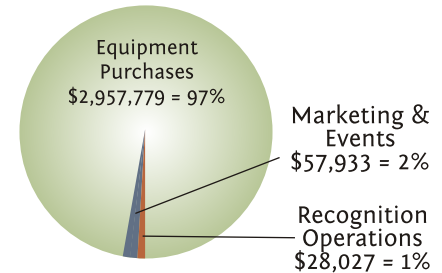
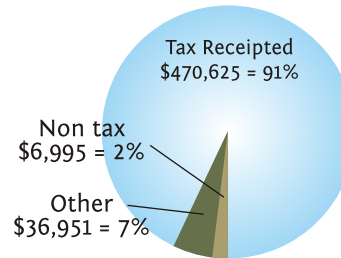

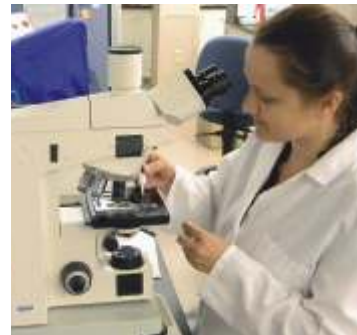
