

# Caring for Our Community

The staff at Shuswap Lake General Hospital and Communities Integrated Services for Interior Health support our community by providing health services in many ways that further our commitment to the "home is best" philosophy of care.

Service provided by the home health team includes:

- Nursing care case management
- Occupational and physiotherapy services
- Palliative care

· Home Support Service, which includes personal care delivered in the client home, a community bath program and respite care to decrease care giver strain. Respite care may be offered through block of home support in the individuals home, by access to community respite beds or through our Adult Day Program or may be offered in combination which is determined by client specific need.

The Community care clinic operates 7 days per week and provides over 4,000 visits annually. Visits include services such as wound care therapy antibiotic administration and catheter maintenance.

The addition of a bladder scanner to our community care clinic through funding from the Shuswap Hospital Foundation will extend the service we are able to offer to our clients and will enhance our ability to extend the level of care we provide in the community.

# We Care for Our Seniors

For those in our community that have entered those 'Golden Years' good health care can become more important and visits to doctors and medical facilities may become more frequent. Our Shuswap area is served with a number of facilities that offer various levels of care depending on needs. Facilities such as Bastion Place which is a 80 bed complex residential care site that is owned and operated by Interior Health. The health care team at Bastion cares for 67 permanent beds and 13 short stay beds where they provide convalescent, respite and end-of-life care for residents. Also provided are recreational pursuits such as activities, games and outings.

Other similar facilities include Hillside Vil-

lage, Piccadilly Care Centre, Pioneer Lodge and Mount Ida Mews which is currently being expanded.

In addition, Harmony Haven provides an adult day services program which is part of Shuswap Home Health Services. Harmony Haven does much to engage our seniors in active and enjoyable events.

#### Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre

The Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre has now been in operation for four years and has become an important part of the fabric of our communities. The Shuswap Hospital Foundation was among the first of the community organizations to help the Sorrento & Area Community Health Centre realize a dream by funding much of the medical equipment needed at the time of opening in November, 2013. The centre continues to be a leader in showing how a Nurse Practitioner in a community-operated facility can provide primary care to a rural population. An expansion last vear enabled the centre to create and

equip a third exam room, and alterations have been made to assist those with mobility challenges with the addition of electric doors, exterior ramp and handrails.

The centre can accept new patients who are not already connected to a family doctor. Those residents who have such a connection to a local practitioner should continue to see that practitioner. 


#### **Sicamous Lab**


Meet with your accountant, lawyer, or financial advisor to determine the appropriate type of gift that meets your financial goals.
